## Rhetorical figures

#### Linguistic configurations

- form and function (F & f)
  - $F \rightarrow$  added salience, aesthetic appeal, mnemonic features
  - $f \rightarrow$  rhetorical (i.e., communicative, pragmatic, suasive) purpose
- vast untapped resource for computational linguistics, including argument mining, text summarization, sentiment detection, credibility assessment, genre detection, authorship attribution, pathology diagnosis and monitoring, voice interaction systems, stylistic analysis, ...

#### Mathematics and Logic

## Philosophy

- [W]e are no less ignorant of that power on which depends the operation of mind on body, or of body on mind.

- Dog, dogs; cat, cats [fish, fish, yes; but no fish, fi]
- Japanese: hito, hitobito; kami, kamigami
- Mandarin Chinese: xiao, xiaoxiao; gaoxing, gaogaoxingxing

#### Principle of sequential order


The order of elements reflects something about order in the meaning

- Stop, drop, and roll.
- Don't drink and drive.
- Bob inherited a fortune and Betty married him. Betty married Bob and he inherited a fortune.
- Veni. Vidi. Vici.
- Kçêkuê sçê a\$sti^ ho\$ A\$si@ba.
   Koku take stick hit Asiba
   Koku hit Asiba with a stick.

# Chiastic Iconicity

- Balance—equal values (equal 'amounts')
  - leverages quantity
- Mutually cancelling orders
  - leverages sequential order ('precedence') w<sup>A</sup>>w<sup>B</sup>, w<sup>B</sup>>w<sup>A</sup>
- Reciprocal direction
  - leverages sequential order ('flow')







## Antimetabole: Rhetorical Functions

 $F(W^A ... W^B ... W^B ... W^A)$  f(irrelevance-of-order)

- m + n = n + m, mn = nm,  $(p \& q) \leftrightarrow (q \& p)$
- Me and you and you and me / No matter how they toss the dice, it had to be. / The only one for me is you, and you for me
- Gretzky and McNall, McNall and Gretzky, joined at the hip, joined at the wallet.
- Let me get one thing straight. I am Rob Ford. I like football and trains. Trains and football.





## Antimetabole: Rhetorical Functions

F(W<sup>A</sup> ... W<sup>B</sup> ... W<sup>A</sup>) f(reciprocal specification)

- Life is the germ and the germ is life.
- A is the double of B if and only if B is the half of A.
- Women's rights are human rights, and human rights are women's rights.
- The good old hockey game is the best game you could name and the best game you could name is good old hockey game.
- Plato is philosophy, and philosophy, Plato.





## Antimetabole: Rhetorical Functions

 $F(W^A ... W^B ... W^B ... W^A)$  f(reciprocal influence)

- If you press a stone with your finger, the finger is also pressed by the stone.
- Women are changing the universities and the universities are changing women.
- Do unto others as you would have others do unto you.
- Nature works with nurture, and nurture with nature, to shape our aptitudes, our health, our very lives.
- Keep care of thy shop and thy shop will keep care of you.



Pseudo-Antimetabole: chiastic repetition of vehicles without the interpretants (form with

different meaning)

Implied Antimetabole: a phrase that evokes its inverse, a well-known expression, forming

a kind of mental antimetabole, a type of allusion

- She sells sea shells by the seashore
- Champagne for my real friends, real pain for my sham friends.
- Light a fire, fight a liar.
- Don't sweat the petty things and don't pet the sweaty things.
- Blanche: You're not as gallant as when you were a boy. John: You're not as buoyant as when you were a gal.





## Morphological Chiamus

 $F(m^A \dots m^B \dots m^A \dots m^B)$ 

- You marketise our education, we educate your market.
- Friendly Americans win America friends.
- Most of the problems in life are because of two reasons: we act without thinking or we think without acting.
- Doing what you like is freedom. Liking what you do is happiness.
- Quitters never win and winners never quit.





## Syntactic Chiamus

$$F(XP^A ... XP^B ... XP^B ... XP^A)$$

- When Adam first of men To first of women Eve.
- It is boring to eat; to sleep is fulfilling.
- Despised, if ugly; if she's fair, betrayed
- By day the frolic, and the dance by night
- He went to the country, to the town went she.
- He came in triumph and in defeat departs.
- Each throat was parched, and glazed each eye.





## **Antimetalepsis**

$$F(I^A \dots I^B \dots I^A \dots I^B)$$

- Old King Cole was a merry old soul And a merry old soul was he.
- T]he new metaphor the brain as a calculating machine is ... fraught with the danger of anthropomorphizing the machine and mechanizing the man
- You can know the position of an electron but you cannot know where it's going... Or you can know its direction, but you cannot know its position.
- It was he who, in a manner of speaking, muddied waters that became too clear or clarified those that had grown murky.
- I think it is easier to take someone in the fishing industry and teach him about currency trading ... than to take someone from the banking industry and teach them how to fish.





#### Pseudo-Antimetabole

$$F(V^A \dots V^B \dots V^B \dots V^A)$$

- Women don't want dates on their condoms; they want condoms on their dates.
- StarKist doesn't want a tuna with good taste. StarKist wants a tuna that tastes good.
- I'll never forget my first corn-silk corona. I was weak for days in a daze for weeks.
- The right to bear arms is slightly less ridiculous than the right to arm bears.
- It was much easier to take Kuhn out of Harvard than Harvard out of Kuhn.
